Questions 1. How old is this child now? 2. Does he normally get presents on his birthday? Why does he like going to school on his birthday? 3. 4. What was special at the ice cream shop? How much birthday money did he get in total? 5. From this passage, do you think he is a kind child who likes 6. to share?

Answers:

- 1) This child is now 8 years old.
- 2) No. He does not normally get presents on his birthday.
- 3) He likes going to school on his birthday because his teachers and friends are extra kind to him then.
- 4) He was allowed to have three scoops of ice cream, because it was his birthday.
- 5) He got one thousand and seven hundred rupees in total.
- 6) I think he is kind and likes to share because he plans to use his birthday money to buy something for his sister.

Answer key:
