Questions 1. Who is narrating this story? What did she get for her birthday gift? 2. 3. What does the child like about her new cycle? What do you think will happen by her next birthday that will 4. make it easier for her to reach the ground? What will she be doing with her father next weekend? 5. 6. Why is she nervous about what she's doing next weekend?

Answers:

- 1) A child is narrating the story.
- 2) She got a cycle for his birthday gift.
- 3) She likes the colour of the cycle, how smooth it is, the sound the bell makes and the basket in the front.
- 4) She will have grown by her next birthday; so it will be easier for her to reach the ground.
- 5) She will be riding on the road with her father next weekend.
- 6) She is excited but also nervous about what she is doing next weekend because it is her first time riding on the road. It might be the fast, motor vehicles on the road that make her nervous.

Answer key:

Please remember that you need to reward your child's ability to reason and use language creatively. The above are only examples of answers. If your child has constructed an answer that is different to this but that is grammatical and sound in its reasoning, mark it as correct.
